

Cost Accounting has the answer!





Opportunities Created by 'Cost Accounting'

Increasing levels of detail and opportunity:

\$\$: Unit Costing: Identifies profitable vs 'loser' products (SKUs)

\$\$\$: Activity Costing: Identifies opportunities to increase profits





Terminology

- Direct vs Indirect
 - Direct Cost that CAN be associated with a specific product
 - Indirect- Cost that CANNOT be cleanly associated with a specific product
- Fixed vs Variable
 - Fixed Costs that DO NOT change with Volume
 - Depreciation, Delivery Truck, Facility Insurance, Utilities (?)
 - Variable Costs that DO change with Volume
 - Plants, Pots, Tags, Soil
- Dump: Buffer, Scrap, & Shrink

	Direct	Indirect			
Fixed	Greenhouse utilities; labor	Office utilities; delivery truck			
Variable	Pot; plant; soil; tag	Equipment maintenance			





What is dump?

Buffer

Extra plants needed to produce the required quantity

Scrap


Finished plants that don't get to retail







Shrink is Costly!



Sell Price: \$10

Shrink: 20%

Expected Lost Total Revenue: (\$10 * 125 plants) * 20% = \$250

Average Shrink Opportunity Cost: \$250 / 125 plants = \$2

Total Shrink Opportunity Cost: \$250 (\$2 per plant)

Let's Try It!

- Production Plan
 - 4-inch pots
 - Grown pot tight
 - 7,000 ft² bench area (10,000 ft² space)
- Variable Costs
 - Plants, Pots, Soil, Tags
 - Shrink
- Fixed Costs
 - Fuel
 - Direct labor
 - Hiring 2 temporary people at \$15 per hour











Average Total Cost vs. Unit Sell Price

Sell Price (Retail Week 18)

Profitability per plant increases by 12%!
